INTER-CULTURAL ASSOCIATION

Details: Training and Orientation

Initial orientation to ICA will be provided by the Immigrant Services Manager, similar to the training that new staff members receive. Students will also receive two hours of sensitivity training around interacting with vulnerable clients from a range of cultural, religious, and ethnic backgrounds.

RAVEN

Details: Orientation

Students will be given materials to review prior to meeting with their supervisors. Students will be expected to have reviewed in detail RAVEN's website, mission, and vision.

THE TOWN OF QUALICUM BEACH

Details: Travel Expectations

The student must be prepared to travel to Qualicum Beach once to conduct the presentation(s) at the end of the academic year. Travel costs will be covered by the organization partner.

PEERS

Details: Training

Before conducting the info session, students will attend a Sex Work 101 Education Session. Students are strongly encouraged to participate in one of two shifts (either night outreach or daytime drop-in)

ANAWIM HOUSE

Details: Training

In-House Orientation: Mandatory Initial Anawim House meeting, tour, walk-through.

THE YUKON HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION

Details: Training and Orientation

Prior to beginning any substantive work, students must participate in a 1.5 training phone meeting with the organization and lawyer supervisor. Further training materials will also be provided.

CANADIAN CIVIL LIBERTIES ASSOCIATION

Details: Training

Students selected for this project must be available for an online training session to be held at 12:00 p.m. EST on Wednesday, October 5th, OR 3:00 p.m. EST on Thursday October 6th . This training session will be 2 hours. Students will be required to participate in three of four civil liberties “intensives” session over the course of the academic year, in conjunction with CCLA Talk Rights students.

LEGAL SERVICES SOCIETY**Details: Training**

An initial training will be conducted mostly in the areas of project concept, the difference between legal information and advice, delivery model, LiveHelp application, and LSS service delivery modules on family law matters. This training can be done remotely.

On-the-task training will be provided by the Lawyer Supervisor, in the course of communications regarding current family law legislation and regulations.

TOGETHER AGAINST POVERTY SOCIETY**Details: Training**

PBSC students will have the opportunity to shadow and consult with the current staff advocate in their given Projects. They will also have access to TAPS resources and training on advocacy practice on behalf of clients and will be provided with constant support from the staff and legal supervisor.

RAINBOW KITCHEN**Details: Optional Orientation and Training**

Students are welcome to come to Rainbow Kitchen and have an orientation along with working with the President to provide any current resources the Society may have.

VOLUNTEER VICTORIA**Details: Training:**

Students must participate in a 2-hour mandatory training session on the new BC Societies Act.

CHOICES ADOPTION**Details: Orientation**

Onsite orientation to agency and BC adoption laws, regulations, policies, Hague Convention on Inter-country Adoption. Participation in team meetings, attendance at Information Session and Adoption Education Program is possible (not mandatory, but recommended)
